Requirements to exhibit

- Entry forms must be received at the show office, Churchill Park, by 12 noon Wednesday 1st November.
- The Emery Pavillion opens at 8am Thursday 31st October and all exhibits must be delivered by 9.30am
- Sorry, no late nominations can be accepted.

Requirements to collect Exhibit

- The hall will be cleared of patrons and closed at 4pm to safely remove cages in preparation to collect exhibits.
- Exhibits can be collected Saturday 4th November between 4.15 & 5pm.
- Receipt of entry is required to enter the hall

SPECIAL REGULATIONS

- **Entries** are what you **write on the form** and take to the office.
- **Exhibit** is the **article** you bring into the Show.
- Exhibits that have previously taken a prize at the Busselton Show shall not be eligible to compete, and any that have been laundered (except for Class 2) will be disqualified.
- Fibres other than wool will be accepted in their appropriate classes.
- This section is open to amateurs only.
- Exhibit tickets must be either stitched on the exhibit or secured with small safety pins
NO SEWING PINS TO BE USED.

EMBROIDERY

SPECIAL AWARDS:

- The **Needles and Friends Group** has donated a prize to be awarded for the most outstanding piece of embroidery.

Class

- 1 Any article on fabric using embroidery thread but not cross-stitch.
- 2 Embroidered cushion (filled) any type of embroidery.
- 3 Any article in crewel work or wool embroidery, eg baby blanket.
- 4 Cross-stitch picture – framed
- 5 Long-stitch picture – framed

All pictures must be properly backed and be ready to hang.

- 6 Any other type of contemporary needlework for which a class has not been provided.
- 7 Any article handmade lace (bobbin, needle lace or knitted).
- 8 Any article in tatting.
- 9 Any article of beaded work.
- 10 Any article featuring raised embroidery (includes Brazilian embroidery, stump work and Elizabethan).
- 11 Any article in candle wicking
- 12 Any article in ribbon embroidery.
- 13 Any other framed article.

- 14 Machine Embroidery – Freehand embroidery, any technique.
- 15 Machine Embroidery – Computerized embroidery.
- 16 Machine Embroidery – Combination of 2 or more of the above techniques.

Baby's garments must be knitted in baby yarn no thicker than 5-ply and fit a baby under 12 months.

Class

- 17 **Youth 14-17 years of age** – Any kind of knitted article.
- 18 **Novice (knitting less than 2 years)** - Any knitted article.
- 19 Any Baby's article.
- 20 Baby's set – jacket, bonnet and booties.
- 21 Cot cover. Approx 110cm x 120cm.
- 22 Child's jumper or cardigan, 10 years & under.
- 23 Lady's or Man's jumper, cardigan or sleeveless vest.
- 24 Knee rug not more than 120cm square.
- 25 Beanie or Scarf.
- 26 Doll or toy animal, whole article must be knitted.
- 27 Tea Cosy.
- 28 Any article of knitting, not scheduled (wool, acrylic or cotton).

CROCHET

Class

- 29 Youth 14-17 years of age – any crocheted article of clothing
- 30 Youth 14-17 years of age – any crocheted novelty item eg toy, doll or decorative article
- 31 Novice (crocheting less than 2 years) - any crocheted article
- 32 Cot cover, approx 110cm x 120cm.
- 33 Any Baby's article.
- 34 Children's or Adult Garment.
- 35 Beanie, Scarf or Gloves.
- 36 Any article in Cotton.
- 37 Doll or Toy.
- 38 Cushion.
- 39 Knee Rug, less than 130cm in any direction.
- 40 Blanket, larger than 130cm in any direction
- 41 Any article in crochet not scheduled, (wool, acrylic or cotton).

- 49 **Youth 14-17 Years of age** – Quilt.
- 50 **Youth 14-17 Years of age** – Any other quilted article (eg. Bag, cushion, wall hanging).
- 51 **Novice (less than 2 years quilting)** Any quilt or quilted article.
- 52 Quilt, more than 75cm on each side, mainly pieced, combination of hand and machine work.
- 53 Quilt, more than 75cm on each side, machine pieced and quilted.
- 54 Quilt, more than 75cm on each side, predominantly applique (hand or machine).
- 55 Quilt, more than 75cm on each side, hand or machine pieced, longarm/professionally quilted.
- 56 Quilt, any size, featuring hand stitchery.
- 57 Quilt, any size, featuring Foundation Piecing technique.
- 58 Wall hanging or art quilt, any technique.
- 59 Table runner.
