Requirements to exhibit

- Nomination of entry forms must be received at the show office, Churchill Park, by 12 noon Wednesday 30th October.
- Exhibits must be delivered to the Emery Pavillion by 9.45am on Friday 1st November.
- Sorry, no late nominations can be accepted.

Requirements to collect exhibit

- The hall will be cleared of patrons and closed at 4pm to safely remove cages in preparation to collect exhibits.
- Exhibits can be collected Saturday 2nd November between 4.15 & 5pm.
- Receipt of entry is required to enter the hall

SPECIAL REGULATIONS:

- All root vegetables to be washed and have at least 15cm trimmed top foliage.
- Please note exhibits may be cut for judging purposes.
- Where there is only one entry in a class, the prize will be at the discretion of the judge.

SPECIAL AWARDS:

- A trophy donated by M & D Harries will be awarded to the best exhibit in classes 1 - 25.
- A cash prize donated for the Mr Brian Walsh Memorial Trophy will be awarded to the best exhibit in classes 26 - 31

Class

- 1 Carrots, three roots.
- 2 Parsnips, three roots.
- 3 Turnips, any variety, three roots.
- 4 Swedes, three roots.
- 5 Pumpkin, one Jarrahdale.
- 6 Pumpkins, two Butternuts.
- 7 Pumpkin, one, any other variety.
- 8 Onions, white, three specimens.
- 9 Onions, brown, three specimens.
- 10 Spring onions, one bunch.
- 11 Lettuce, one head.
- 12 Cauliflower, one head.
- 13 Cabbage, one head.
- 14 Broccoli, one head.
- 15 Beetroot, three roots.
- 16 Snow Peas in shell, ten on a plate.
- 17 Peas, in shell, ten on a plate.
- 18 Broad Beans, ten on a plate.
- 19 Radishes, six roots.
- 20 Silver Beet, three leaves – green.
- 21 Silver Beet, three leaves – coloured.

- 22 Potatoes, Nadine, no less than 2kg
- 23 Potatoes, Ruby Lou, no less than 2kg.
- 24 Potatoes, any other variety, no less than 2kg.
- 25 Any other variety – vegetables - five on a plate.
- 26 Rhubarb, six stalks, pulled not cut, trimmed leaves to 15cm.
- 27 Oranges, five on a plate.
- 28 Lemons, five on a plate.
- 29 Strawberries, seven on a plate.
- 30 Loquats, fifteen on a plate.
- 31 Any other variety – fruit – five on a plate.

- 32 Collection of herbs, not less than three named varieties in a container no larger than 450mm x 450mm.
- 33 THE BIG COLLECTION, a selection fruit and vegetables judged by quality.
Minimum 8 varieties to be assembled as one exhibit.
Varieties in heads to show one single head in each case, bunches not less than 3
First Prize \$14; Second Prize \$8.
